IMPORTANT SAFEGUARDS

For your protection, please read these safety instructions completely before operating the appliance, and keep this manual for future reference

Carefully observe all warnings, precautions and instructions on the appliance and in the operating instructions, and adhere to them.

INSTALLATION -

Water and Moisture - Do not use powering operated appliances near water - for example near a bathtub, washbowl, kitchen sink, or laundry tub, in a wet basement, or near a swimming pool, etc.



Heat - Do not place the appliance near or over a radiator or heat register, or where it is exposed to direct sunlight



USE

Power Source - This appliance should be operated only from the type of power source indicated on the marking label. If you are not sure of the type of electrical power supplied to your home, consult your dealer or local power company. For those appliances designed to operate from



Power-Cord Protection - Route the power, cord so that it is not likely to be walked on or pinched by items placed upon or against them, paying particular attention to the plugs, receptacles, and the point where the cord exits from the appliance.



Ventilation - The slots and openings in the cabinet are provided for necessary ventilation. To ensure reliable operation of the appliance, and to protect to move operation of the appliance, and to protect it from overheating, these slots and openings must never be blocked or covered. - Never cover the slots and openings with a cloth or other materials.



 Never block the slots and openings by placing the appliance on a bed, sofa, rug or other sim surface



 Never place the appliance in a confined space. such as a bookcase, or built-in cabinet,unless proper ventilation is provided.



Grounding or Polarization - This appliance is equipped with a polarized AC power cord Plug(a plug having one blade wider than the other), or with two-wire grounding type plug) Plug having a second pin for grounding). A follow the instructions below

For the appliance with a polarized AC powe

Cord plug: This plug will fit into the power outlet only This piug will int timo the power outer only one way. This is a safety feature. If you are unable to insert the plug fully into the outlet, try reversing The plug. If the plug should still fail to fit, contact your electrician to have a suitable outlet Installed. Do not defeat the safety purpose of the Polarized plug by forcing it in.

Accessories - Do not place the appliance on an unstable cart, stand, tripod, bracket, or table. The appliance may fall, causing serious injury to a bild one oblit, and applies down on the two child or an adult, and serious damage to the appliance,Use only a cart, stand, tripod, bracket, or table recommended.



- An appliance and cart combination should be moved with care. Quick stops, excessive force, and uneven surfaces may cause the appliance and cart combination to overturn.



WALL or Ceiling Mounting - If your appliance can be mounted to a wall or ceiling, mount it only as recommended.

Overloading - Do not overload wall outlets, extension cords or convenience receptacles beyond their capacity, since this can result in fire r electric shock



When not in use -Unplug the power cord of the appliance from the outlet when left unused for a long period of time. To disconnect the To disconnect the cord, pull it out by grasping the plug. Never pull the plug out by the cord.



Object and Liquid Entry - Never push objects of any kind into the appliance through openings as they may touch dangerous voltage points or short out parts that could result in a fire or electric shock. Never spill liquid of any kind on the appliance.

Cleaning - Unplug the appliance from the wall outlet before cleaning or polishing it. Do not use liquid cleaners or aerosol cleaners. Use a cloth lightly dampened with water for cleaning the exterior of the appliance. Clean the appliance only as recommended

ANTENNAS

Outdoor Antenna Grounding - If an outdoor antenna or cable system is installed, follow the precautions below.

An outoor antenna system should not be located in the vicinity of overhead power lines or other electric light or power circuits, or where it can come in contact with such power lines or circuits. Be sure the antenna system is gorunded so as to provide some protection against voltage surges and built-up static charges. SERVICE








FRONT AND REAR PANEL





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Press to power on the unit from standby mode, press again to turn to standby mode.

ANGLE

During playback a DVD disc with multi-angle recording, press repeatedly to select the viewing angle. (It depends on the recording of disc).

SUBTITLE

During DVD playback, press repeatedly to select the desired subtitle (It depends on recording of disc).

VIDEO

Press to switch video mode.

GOTO

DVD:

During DVD playback, press the GOTO Button once, the Title, Chapter and Time selection menu will appear on screen. Use the Direction and Numeric Buttons to select the desired title, chapter and time, then press the ENTER Button to start playback.

CD:

During CD playback, press the GOTO Button once, the Track and Time selection menu will appear on screen. Use the Direction and Numeric Buttons to select the desired track and time, then press the ENTER Button to start playback.

L/R

Press to change to Mono L, Mono R, Mix Mono or Stereo(It depends on disc type).

SETUP

Press to enter setup menu, using navigation and ENTER button to set to desired setting. Press the setup button to exit setup menu.

NOTE: The parental passcode is "8888".

TITLE

Press to return to disc's title page (Function depends on the recording of the disc).

MENU

Press to return to disc's menu page (Function depends on the recording of the disc).

RETURN

Press to return to previous menu. (It depends on the recording of the disc).

MUTE

Press to turn off the sound, press again to resume.

AUDIO

During playback, press repeatedly to select the desired audio mode. (Function depends on the recording of disc).

RESET

Press to reset to default settings.

VOL +/-

Press to adjust volume level.

OSD (On Screen Display)

During playback, press repeatedly to display playing status or turn it off.

P/N (PAL/NTSC)

Press repeatedly to select and set the color system to NTSC, PAL or AUTO to match the color system of the connected TV.

A-B

During playback, press the A-B Button to define the starting point, press again to define the ending ponit, the unit will then play the selected section repeatedly. To cancel, press the A-B Button again. (This function is not available on all discs).

ZOOM

During movies playback, press repeatedly to zoom in or zoom out the picture. (It depends on the recording of the disc).

SLOW

During playback, press the SLOW Button repeatedly to set slow motion speed. Press ▶II (Play/Pause) Button to resume normal playback.

USB

Press to enter DISC/USB mode selection window, using direction and ENTER button on to select and set to desired mode.

Repeat Playing: (DVD)

- ~ Press the REPEAT button to "Repeat Chapter", the current chapter will be played repeatedly.
- ~ Press the REPEAT button again to "Repeat Title", the ttitle will be played repeatedly.
- ~ Press the REPEAT button the third time to "Repeat All", all files will be played repeatedly.
- ~ Press the REPEAT button the fourth time to "Repeat Off", repeat will be cancelled.

Repeat Playing: (CD)


- ~ Press the REPEAT button to "Repeat 1", the current track will be played repeatedly.
- ~ Press the REPEAT button again to "Repeat All", all tracks will be played repeatedly.
- ~ Press the REPEAT button the third time to "Repeat Off ", repeat will be cancelled.

(CD/DVD)Program:

 During DVD or CD playback, press the PROG Button on remote control, the program setting menu will appear as below:

USB function

USB

Choose this button to setup DISC, USB mode

DISC only:

If you are only playing DISC (but no USB), after you put disc into the tray , the appliance will play the DISC automatically.

USB only:

If you are only playing USB (but no Disc), after you insert the USB into the USB port, the appliance will play the USB automatically.

DISC/USB both:


If you put the disc in the tray and in the meantime insert the USB into the USB port, the appliance will play the DISC in priority .

If you want to switch to playing the USB, please press the USB button to pop up the DISC/USB mode selection window, using navigation button to select USB, press ENTER to confirm, the appliance then recognize and read the USB.

If you want to switch to playing the Disc from USB, please press the USB button to pop up the DISC/USB mode selection window, using navigation button to select DISC, press ENTER to confirm, the appliance will turn back to disc reading.







TROUBLESHOOTING

REMOTE CONTROL IS INSENSITIVE OR DOES NOT WORK

Check the batteries of remote control and make sure that they are to be powerful and good conductivity. Direct the remote control to the IR sensor of the player.

Check whether there are some obstacles between the remote control and IR sensor.

ABNORMAL FUNCTION OPERATION

Turn off the power, and then turn on again.

DISC IS LOCKED IN THE TRAY

The disc can not be taken out of the tray when the player is reading, so you have to turn off the power and turn on again, press OPEN/CLOSE key immediately to open the tray.
